- Cincy boasts a labor force of 1,170,655.

- Cincy has seven Fortune 500 companies, the 19th most of any metropolitan area. Ohio has 24, the fifth most of any state.
- Cincy has the 27th largest GDP in the US, coming in at \$153 billion. It is the largest GDP of any metropolitan area in Ohio or Kentucky.
- We have 1,081,867 jobs in our region, 47.7% of which pay more than \$3,333 per month.

01.	Fountain Square - This downtown restaurant and entertainment hub is a can't miss place for snacks, dinner, ice skating in the winter, or an afternoon stroll year-round.
02.	FC Cincinnati at TQL Stadium - Take in a soccer game in the beautiful all-new MLS stadium in downtown Cincy, steps from Washington Park and OTR restaurants and bars.
03.	Over-the-Rhine (OTR) - The country's largest collection of Italianate Renaissance-Style architecture is home to a bustling entertainment district of shops, restaurants, craft bars & breweries.
04.	Findlay Market - Serving Cincinnati since 1855, this is one of the oldest public markets in the country. Its vendors represent generations of immigration from central Europe, southeast Asia, and the Middle East. Foodie Heaven!
05.	DORA District at The Banks (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area) - from 11am to 1am daily, the 85-acre district at The Banks along the Ohio riverfront allows guests to take their beverage purchased from one of 18 establishments and explore our public plazas and green spaces.

- Nick and Drew Lachey brothers, members of the band 98 Degrees, business partners, celebrity guest stars, and hosts in a range of popular TV shows were born and raised in Cincinnati.

CULINARY & COCKTAILS: NEW AND TREASURED

While our famous mole-inspired chili is admittedly awesome, Cincy boasts a varied slate of incredibly delicious and diverse dishes. The Cincinnati region saw 70 new dining establishments open in 2021. Here are the places with drinks & eats we can't wait to tackle:

GHOST BABY (OPENED IN JULY 2020)

Fifty feet underground in an old lagering tunnel beneath the hip Over-the-Rhine neighborhood, this cocktail lounge was one of the only places where one could find live music after the original 'shelter in place' mandates were lifted.

THE FOUNDRY AT FOUNTAIN PLACE

This prime location at the edge of downtown's Fountain Square welcomes new French restaurant, Royce, and a new location for Cincy's treasured steak house, Jeff Ruby's.

FOOD & DRINK TOURS

Treasured favorites from the Cincy region are back in action, including the **Cincinnati Brewing Heritage Trail**, the **Kentucky Bourbon Trail** & the **B-Line**. Other tours for imbibing local spirits include the **Cincy Brew Bus** and **Craft Connection Brewery Tours**.

ARTS & CULTURE: BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

Cincy punches above its weight class with some of the oldest, wealthiest, and most noteworthy cultural institutions in the entire country. It's also one of only 13 cities in the U.S. with professional companies in all the arts – ballet, opera, symphony, theater, and fine & contemporary art museums.

CINCINNATI ART MUSEUM'S ART CLIMB

The Art Climb's ribbon-cutting ceremony was held in June 2020, and the CAM has continued to add more and more elements to this activation of its museum grounds, including outdoor sculptures, lighting components, and a large pavilion where visitors can enjoy a view of the city.

VALENTINE CENTER FOR DANCE

Valentine Center for Dance: The Margaret and Michael Valentine Center for Dance opened September 2021, as the Cincinnati Ballet's permanent new headquarters. Already the 57,000 square-foot building is a vibrant hub of activity which will only grow as academy students fill their own studios and community members begin to populate a growing menu of public programs.

BLINK[®]

October 13 - 16, 2022

One of Cincy's most anticipated events is making a return next fall. In its inaugural year (2017), BLINK® was one of the largest light, art, and projection-mapping events in the nation, featuring large-scale installations, murals, urban artscapes, media light and interactive art.

OKTOBERFEST-ZINZINNATI® September 15 - 18, 2022

Although cancelled in 2020, this celebration of German culture and heritage returned in 2021 as THE LARGEST OKTOBERFEST IN THE WORLD due to a cancelled Oktoberfest in Munich. Annually the largest U.S. Oktoberfest, Cincinnati welcomes over half a million people to its temporary biergartens, stages and food tents along 2nd and 3rd streets in its riverfront district.

ARTS LEGACY & BLACK MUSICIANS

None other than the Godfather of Soul himself - James Brown - got his start in Cincy with King Records.

The Cincinnati Black Music Walk of Fame's inaugural first four honorees include The Isley Brothers (remember "Twist and Shout") and Rock & Roll Hall of Famer Bootsy Collins. The induction ceremony will be held in July.

TASTE OF CINCINNATI May 28 - 30, 2022

One of the nation's largest free culinary arts festivals, this Cincinnati tradition started in 1979 and features over 65 restaurants, food trucks and Findlay Market vendors along with several stages of live entertainment.

FC CINCINNATI AT THE NEW TQL STADIUM (OPENED MAY 2021)

FC Cincinnati is the city's 3rd major league sports team, joining the Reds and Bengals in 2018, when Major League Soccer awarded an expansion franchise to Cincinnati. The West End Stadium broke ground that December and held its ribbon cutting in May 2021 just before FC Cincinnati's first home match in the new stadium.

WESTERN & SOUTHERN OPEN (AUGUST 13-21, 2022):

The Cincinnati Tennis Masters, long branded the Western & Southern Open, has been a staple in Cincy since 1899. A favorite among players and fans alike, the tournament is the second largest summer tennis event in the U.S., right before the U.S. Open.

NEW RESTAURANT OPENINGS

OTR STILL HOUSE

The OTR Still House **opened** along Central Parkway, and with it Sqr – pronounced "skewer" – a play on Japanese street food with southern influences, cooked atop a robata grill. Try the collard green steamed dumplings with bourbon barrel soy sauce; it's life-changing.

LATIN HOUSE

Cincyi's first Cuban restaurant, the Latin House, opened its doors in the former Sports Page restaurant space downtown. We're huge fans of the plaintain soup!

HERBAN VEGANS

Herban Vegans, a "seafood" restaurant serving <u>completely plant-based fare</u>, opened its doors across from Findlay Market. The Cauli Wingz pair nicely with the Fysh Fry - go on, you know you want to give it a try!

PENSIVE DISTILLING

Pensive Distilling, <u>a craft distillery and restaurant</u> named and themed after winners of the Kentucky Derby, opened on Monmouth Street in Newport in May. Their establishment champions the winning spirit of our community (and, we've got to say, we're feeling that right now!) Their American Pharaoh sliders are simply addictive.

ST. FRANCIS APIZZA

St. Francis Apizza, named a "Best Pizza" of Cincinnati 2021 by the Enquirer, opened in <u>Hyde Park in</u> <u>February.</u> Pro tip: Try the Garlic and Greens with added pepperoni (and some hot honey if you're feeling fancy.)

MASHROOTS MOFONGO BAR

MashRoots Mofongo Bar, specializing in a **fast-casual Puerto Rican dish**, opened in January in College Hill. The fried chicken bowls are unlike anything we've ever seen!

Annual donations from residents and employees in 300 businesses are one of our city's traditions going back 100 years. **ArtsWave is the largest community arts campaign in the nation**, with tens of thousands of donors and nearly \$12 million raised each year, making it the region's engine for the arts.

INNOVATION, STARTUPS, AND SUSTAINABILITY IN CINCY



Everybody knows about San Francisco's Silicon Valley, but it's 2022: The true spotlight going forward's going to be on the Silicon Heartland - Ohio and the Cincy area.

CINCY INNOVATION FAST FACTS

- The University of Cincinnati received the 2021 IEP Talent Award from the Association of Public & Land-Grant Universities. This award honors an institution with exemplary initiatives in education and workforce development.
- In 2021, Ohio funded two additional innovation districts in Cleveland and Columbus, both ready to leverage the model established by Cincy.
- The Cincinnati Innovation District announced partnerships with Lightship Foundation, Great American Insurance Company, and Orange Grove Bio into our innovation ecosystem.

The Cincinnati Innovation District has overseen:

- A 185% increase in issued patents
- A 159% increase in tech disclosures
- \$3.3B in total regional impact
- The launch of 198 startups
- The creation of 1,790 jobs
- …in less than three years. The 1819 Innovation Hub is at capacity (and we're just getting started).

INVENTIONS AND INSPIRATION IN OHIO

Ohio's **Silicon**

Heartland is home to a new Intel silicon chip factory, three solar panel manufacturing plants, the Lordstown Motors electric vehicle manufacturing plant, and productive hubs of solar energy equipment manufacturing. Cincy is a major biotech

hub. Orange Grove Bio, a biotech company, relocated their HQ from New York to Cincinnati. "We moved our headquarters to the Cincinnati Innovation District because of the people. People are the underlying foundation of any business." - Ryan Fox, Chief Business Operations Officer Cincy has more than 10 hospitals and numerous bioscience research companies. It's also home to Cincinnati Children's, a pediatric care and research institution consistently ranked in the **top five hospitals in the nation.**

Cincinnati Innovation District, powered by the University of Cincinnati, has overseen **\$3.3 billion in total regional impact** (and nearly 200 start-ups).

SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES IN CINCY

- Headquartered in Cincy, Procter & Gamble successfully reached its 2020 goal of purchasing 100% renewable electricity in the US and Canada.
- Cincy is building <u>the nation's largest municipal solar farm</u>, which is roughly the size of 750 football fields and will generate enough electricity to power Greater Cincinnati Water Works, all police districts, plus City Hall.
- Cincinnati's 2030 Districts are regional businesses, organizations committed to **cutting carbon emissions by 50%** by 2030
- Cincy has one of about two-dozen 2030 Districts in North America
- Participants agree to cut down on energy use, water consumption, and transportation emissions through a mixture of tech innovations and building design elements
